All researchers are obliged to conform to rules of Good Scientific Practice. These rules are implicit, but the border between acceptable and unacceptable practice is often unclear.

What is responsible research conduct? How can I present data accurately? What exactly is plagiarism, and how can it be avoided? What are the pros and cons of open science? What is an ombudsperson?

To raise awareness on these questions, the life science graduate programs in the greater Munich area, supported by the Graduate Center^{LMU}, have joined forces to organize a campus-wide educational event aimed towards next generation researchers.
